


School autonomy and inspection

History	Governance	Inspection
Nineties	* Many central regulations; * Gradual enlargement schools' decision making power	* Checking compliance * Full quality inspections (including management quality)
From 2000	School responsible for: - organisation of teaching and learning - personnel/ material goods * Block grant funding	* Inspection focus on schools' quality assurance * Proportional supervision
From 2007	* Separation between school management and internal supervision * Horizontal accountability	* Selective risk based supervision * Checking compliance with regulations






Dilemmas to be solved

- Schools still have difficulties with proper quality management and accountability
- Parents do not exercise much influence on school quality
- Internal supervision is not yet professional and independent
- Inspectorate has difficulties with accountability information of schools
