The RACAPE / ARACIP Mission

RAQAPE / ARACIP accomplishes:

- The external evaluation of the quality of education offered by accredited educational organizations.
- The external evaluation for authorization and accreditation of all educational organizations at pre-university level.







Who is involved in quality assurance?

The stakeholders (teachers, pupils, parents, management etc.) – who generate quality in education;

The Commission for Quality Assurance and Evaluation (CQAE) – responsible for the internal evaluation at school level;

The School Inspectorate – responsible for the quality control;

The Romanian Agency for Quality Assurance in Pre-University Education – RAQAPE / ARACIP – responsible for the external evaluation.







External evaluation

The external evaluation of schools

- Is based on National Standards for authorization, accreditation and for quality of education provision
- Aims authorization / accreditation and the assessment of the quality of educational services provided by schools







Methodology

- self evaluation
- school visit documents analysis, dialogue with stakeholders
- external evaluation report, analyzed, approved and published on RAQAPE web site
- feedback to school







Registers posted on RAQAPE web site

- Register of all the Romanian public and private schools with authorization and accreditation
- Register of all the Romanian public and private schools with recurrent evaluation
- Register of RAQAPE external evaluators







ICT techniques used in the external evaluation

- notebooks used by external evaluators
 - usual software (OFFICE, HTML etc.);
- the external evaluation report has an electronic form and published on RAQAPE web site.







Romanian Efforts for improvement quality of education from ICT perspective







RAQAPE Project funded by ESF: "Developing the national system of management and quality assurance in pre-university education" (2008-2011 – 5 mil. EUR ongoing)

Expected results from ICT perspective:

- Database "The National Map of Educational Risk"
- ICT application for decision support used for all the beneficiaries of educational services







Database "National Map of Educational Risk"

Benefits: judgment of added-value by comparing the results obtained by a school with the expected results for the specific category.

- 15 national risk indicators (ex: family educational level, family economical level, staff qualification and turnover, truancy, the real use of ICT etc.);
- 5 result indicators (surviving rate, retention rate, retention rate for pupils at risk, national exams results etc.);
- 5 risk levels: "very high risk", "high risk", "medium risk", "low risk", "very low risk").







ICT Application for decision support

- Is established at national level;
- Is based on data collection and analyses
- Is used by all the beneficiaries of the educational services.





RAQAPE Project funded by ESF: ,, Support for schools in implementing quality assurance handbook "education" (in evaluation - 2010-2012 – 5 mil. EUR)

Expected results from ICT perspective:

Quality assurance handbook for schools, using a specific software







The software will support the following activities:

- The establishment and the activity of the Committee for the Evaluation and Quality Assurance
- The development of procedures and tools regarding quality assurance and internal evaluation
- The self-assessment procedures using national quality standards and indicators.
- Designing programs and activities in order to improve the quality.







The software will support the following activities:

- The implementation of quality improvement programs and activities
- The evaluation of quality improvement programs and activities
- Reporting on quality the yearly report.





Requirements:

- The application will conduct the user through the "quality circle" (plan-do-check-act).
- Intuitive application and easy to use by teachers having below average IT knowledge and skills.
- User friendly and attractive interface.
- Step by step tutorial







Positive aspects

- Reducing the workload (for RAQAPE staff, for external evaluators and for the school personnel involved in quality assurance and evaluation)
- Reducing the time spent on evaluation activities and drafting documents with at least 50%
- Reducing the costs of internal and external evaluation
- Increasing communication
- Ensuring transparence
- Optimizing the informational and organizational data flows at school level







Negative aspects

- Lack of access at the Internet in some remote locations.
- Not all schools have access at broad band Internet.





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
