









The Scottish approach to quality improvement

In recent years, Scotland has become identified internationally with a particular approach to accountability and improvement which is built on an explicit combination of internal and external evaluation.

The premise of the approach is that schools must take responsibility for the quality of the education which they provide and be committed to continuous improvement.

Its centrepiece is a set of quality indicators contained in a document called *How Good Is Our School?* These indicators embody good practice and establish a common language of quality.
