1) Financial overview

2) Statutes – changes of articles

We need to change and update some articles of the SICI Statutes. The Secretariat examined what would be the best option:

- adding internal rules
- changing the existing articles.

Changing the articles appeared to be the best solution.

During the General Assembly in Bielefeld, all proposals concerning the changes in articles were approved by all SICI members

Art. 8 - Working procedures and management bodies

The Association's management bodies consist of:

- the General Assembly
- the Executive Committee

The following general assumptions apply to the languages used within the Association:

- only in the general meeting will provisions be made for one or other forms of translation of English into French and vice versa;
- members of the executive committee all members should take steps amongst themselves to solve any language problems that might arise during meetings of the executive committee;
- official documents such as articles of association and correspondence relating to membership will be circulated in both French and English;
- either the English language or the French language will be used in the case of all other documents.

Art. 9 §2 - Meeting of the General Assembly

2. A meeting of the general assembly will be held at least once per year - the annual meeting of the general assembly. This meeting will be held by six months at the latest following the closure of the Association's year. The annual meeting of the general assembly will discuss matters including:

Art. 13 §1, §3, §4d – Management

- 1. The executive committee of the Association consists of a minimum of five persons. Appointment of members of the executive committee is made by the general assembly, though the general assembly may also decide that one member of the executive committee should be appointed from outside of the Association's membership.
- 3. Each of the members of the executive committee will step down two three years after being appointed at the latest, in accordance with a retirement schedule to be set up by the executive committee. Retiring members of the executive committee are immediately eligible for re-

appointment. Members of the executive committee appointed to fill an interim vacancy will adopt the position on the retirement schedule occupied by their predecessors.

- 4. The membership of the executive committee comes to an end:
 - a. on discharge by the general assembly, as referred to above in article 7 paragraph 2;
 - b. on the resignation of the member of the executive committee;
 - c. in the case of a member of the executive committee appointed from the Association's members, on termination of his membership of the Association;
 - d. when the member of the executive committee concerned reaches the age of sixty five. at the GA the second year after the year of retirement;
 - e. on the winding up of the legal entity constituting the executive committee.

Art. 16 §3 - Annual report, computation and accounting, funds committee

3. The executive committee will present its annual report and a report of its management of the Association during the previous financial year, accompanied by the necessary documents, at a meeting of the general assembly to be held within six months of the closure of the association year, except where this term is extended by the general assembly. Following the expiry of this period, any member of the Association is entitled to legally enforce the executive committee to provide these reports.

5) Proposals GA 2009

Proposal 1

7) SICI Inspectors Academy

a. Professional development activities and workshops

Citizenship – Copenhagen (March 2010)

- 61 people attended the workshop:
 - 33 from 15 SICI members
 - 28 Danish participants
- Successful features of the Workshop:
 - School visits with 'mini inspections'
 - 'Carousel' to present findings of visits
- Key Outcomes:
 - No single definition of citizenship possible
 - About providing knowledge about / experience in / practice of citizenship
 - Draft overarching indicator for inspecting citizenship elaborated
- The report has been distributed and is published on the website.

School Outcomes - Amsterdam (May 2010)

• 85 people attended the workshop:

- Participants from the Netherlands
- 23 countries/regions
- Key points:
 - Evaluating student achievement essential
 - Clear communication of findings essential
 - Must also figure strongly in self-evaluation
- Key Outcomes:
 - Social as well as academic outcomes to be considered
 - Calculating school output difficult but not impossible
 - Inspectors must have reliable and fair output indicators, practical and recognisable by schools
- The report is imminent
- A DVD is available

Teaching and Learning - Cardiff (September 2010)

- 47 people attended the workshop:
 - Participants from Estyn (Wales)
 - 16 countries/regions
- Key points:
 - Differences across members in approach
 - Approaches are changing
 - Range of ways of feeding back on quality

<u>Serbia</u>:

SICI is immediately involved in an 18 month project to develop and introduce a system of monitoring school quality in Serbia. The project began with the 'kick-off' conference in Belgrade in June 2009: an introduction to the SICI perspective on evaluation, measurement and monitoring of school quality.

A strong international team of experienced inspectors from SICI was expertly led by Gonnie Amelsvoort, but strengthened by the involvement of colleagues with different experiences in several inspectorates.

In December, the first certificates (SICI/Netherlands Inspectorate) will be issued to 30 new inspectors.

The theme of the conference is "Quality assurance and transparency as interface between vocational education and training, school education and higher education."
