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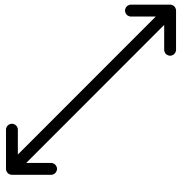

expanding expectations



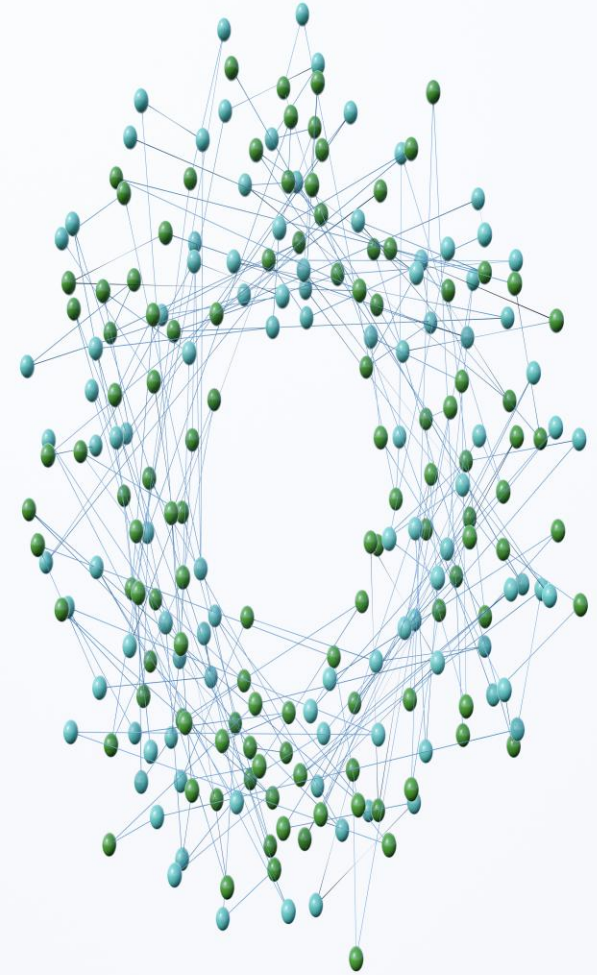
increasing complexity

- less clarity

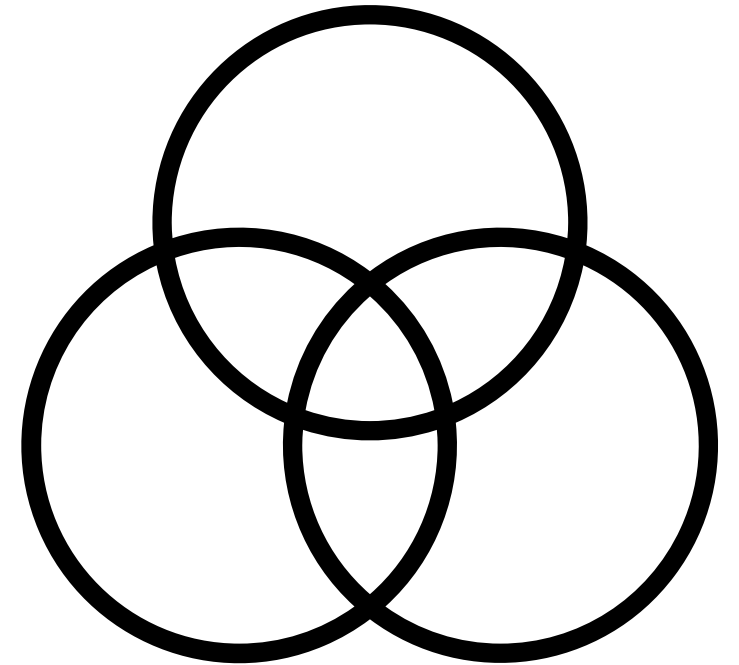


Improvement is **continuous**.
